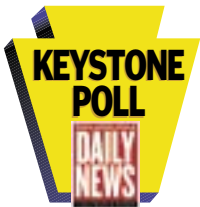
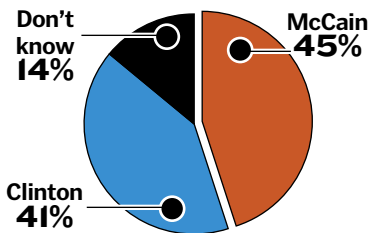


# GIULIANI, MCCAIN TOP CLINTON, OBAMA

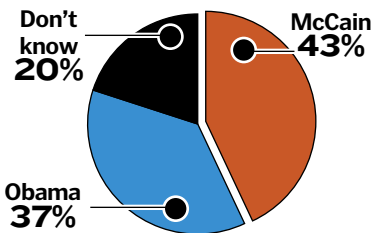
A Republican candidate for president hasn't won Pennsylvania since 1988, but that might change in 2008 despite the unpopularity of President Bush. The latest *Daily News/Keystone* Poll shows both of the leading contenders for the GOP nomination — former New York City Mayor Rudy Giuliani and U.S. Sen. John McCain — beating either of the leading Democrats — U.S. Sens. Hillary Clinton and Barack Obama.



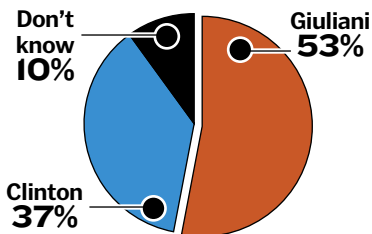
If the 2008 election for president was being held today and the candidates were the Democrat Hillary Clinton and the Republican John McCain, for whom would you vote?



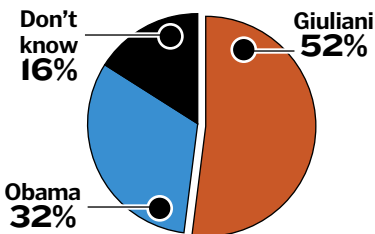
If the 2008 election for president was being held today and the candidates were the Democrat Barack Obama and the Republican John McCain, for whom would you vote?

METHODOLOGY: The *Daily News/Keystone* Poll was conducted by Franklin & Marshall College's Center for Opinion Research, which surveyed 638 Pennsylvania residents of the state, 540 of them registered voters, Feb. 19-25. The margin of error is 3.9% for the total sample and 4.2% for registered voters.
