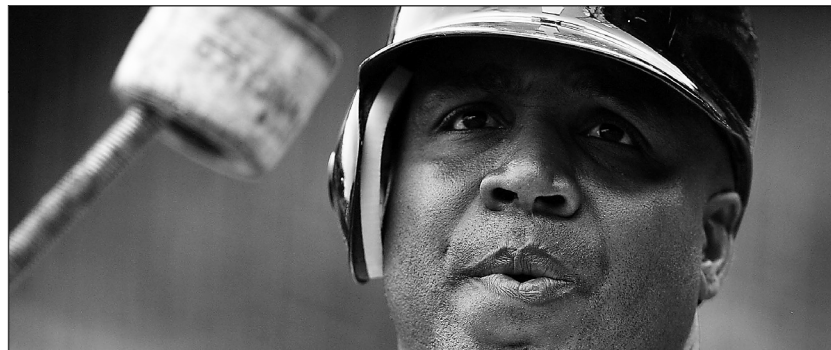


# ON AARON'S DOORSTEP
