Congressman Brady Energized by Court Ruling; Keeps Takin' his Campaign to the Streets

Brady to Announce Housing Repair Plan at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday

PHILADELPHIA – Congressman Bob Brady today said he was gratified that Judge Patrick J. Toole Jr. dismissed a court challenge of his Nominating Petitions. Congressman Brady will not be available for interviews today, but will be holding a 10:00 a.m. press conference to announce a new housing repair policy at 2605 North 9th Street, just below 9th and Lehigh Ave.

“I am running for Mayor thanks to 24,000 Philadelphians, who signed my nominating petitions,” said Brady from his Congressional office after learning Luzerne County Judge Toole affirmed his position on the ballot. “I am keeping my campaign in the streets where violence is at a crisis level, and our schools are in a chaotic state.

“Anyone has the right to challenge petitions, but Tom Knox crossed the line with mean-spirited personal attacks on me and thousands of working men and women. Personal attacks will not educate one child; personal attacks will not get one more gun off the streets, and personal attacks will not create one more job.

“This challenge has energized my supporters and now we are in a full sprint to the finish line. Each week I will travel across the City I love, visiting neighborhoods and touching the people who support my bid for Mayor”

Congressman Brady thanked his legal team led by Steve Cozen at Cozen O’Connor, his staff, family and all of the people who supported him throughout this challenging experience.
